Mu Chapter Is Blooming This Spring

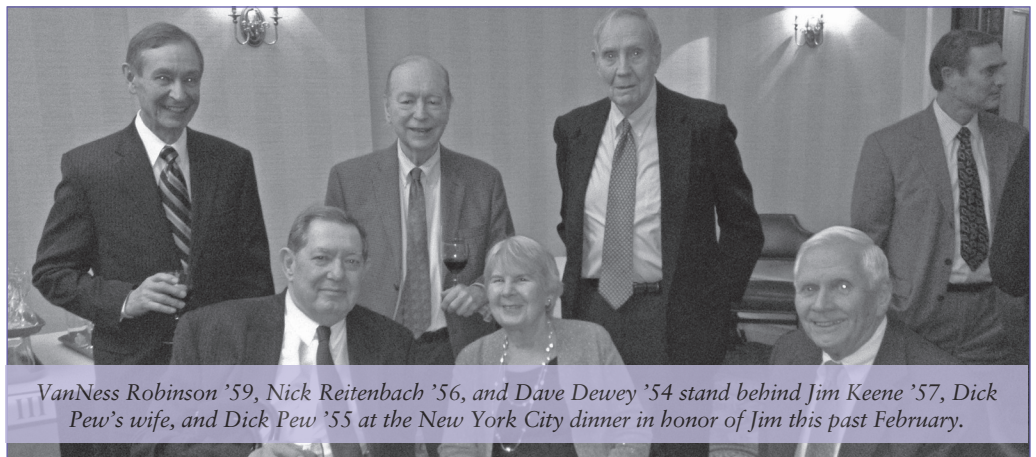

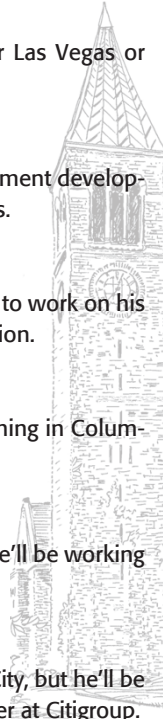
